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**More conventions and meetings coming to Boston in next three years than
at any time in state history**
Record 1.66 million hotel room nights to be generated by events from 2010 to 2012

Boston's convention business will hit a historic milestone in the next three years as more conventions and meetings come to town than at any time in the state's history, according to the latest figures from the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority.

In fact, 2012 is expected to break all Boston records for meeting and convention business, with a scheduled 613,000 room nights. Prior to this, 2006 broke all Massachusetts records with 576,000 hotel room nights.

Highlights of 2012 include the BIO International Convention in June, with 41,200 expected room nights, the American Society of Radiation Oncology annual meeting in October with 38,700 room nights, and the National School Boards Association convention in April 2012 with 33,300 room nights.

The following year, 2013, will be the second largest convention year in MCCA and Boston history, with 599,000 hotel room nights. And 2010, 2011 and 2012 are expected to generate a combined 1.66 million hotel room nights, more than has ever been generated in any three years in the state of Massachusetts.

"This economy has seen other destinations slip behind, but Boston's brand is winning in the convention and meeting industry," said James E. Rooney, executive director of the MCCA. "And these numbers do not include short-term events, which are typically unknown but range from 35,000 to 50,000 hotel room nights per year."

Hotel room nights are the key gauge for convention business in Massachusetts, with about 25 percent of all hotel room tax going directly to the Commonwealth.

Boston is defying the convention and meeting industry's trends in other areas as well. While corporate and trade show events are down both here and nationwide, 85 percent of the events taking place in Boston are association events, which remain stable. Even corporate and trade show numbers in Boston are suffering far less than other cities.

Event highlights this year include 41,600 room nights from the Risk and Insurance Management Society in April, the American Society of Cataract & Refractive Surgery Symposium and Congress with 36,225 room nights, also in April, and the American Chemical Society Fall National Congress in August. Highlights for 2011 include the Association of Financial Professional 2011 Annual Conference in November 2011, and the Endocrine Society Annual Meeting in June. Highlights for 2013 include the Bio International Convention with 41,200 room nights in June, the American Society for Radiation Oncology Annual Meeting with 38,775 room nights in October, and the National School Boards Association Annual Convention with 33,300 room night in April.

About the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (MCCA)

The Massachusetts Convention Center Authority owns and oversees the operations of the

Boston Convention & Exhibition Center, the John B. Hynes Veterans Memorial Convention Center, the MassMutual Center in Springfield, MA and the Boston Common Parking Garage.
